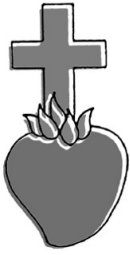

God renewed our awareness of spiritual gifts because we
needed to know about them to grow in our Christian lives.
They're not decorations or extra added attractions. If the
apostles and Mary in the upper room needed spiritual gifts
and discernment, I need them too.

Its important to look at the Charismatic Renewal as a work
of God. That doesn't mean that everything that has occurred
has been God's will. Thank God that he doesn't 'check out'
when we stray from him. It does mean that God is patiently
leading us on very gently, very lovingly and for this reason
we should not disdain what He has done in the past or how
He has done it.

I look back on the past and treasure it but we cannot live in
the past. We need to be in touch with God now, in the
present moment. I value the things He did in the early days
of the Charismatic Renewal, even though there were many
painful lessons. I have no desire to go back, none
whatsoever. The *good old days are right now*. The good old
days are when God *is* acting, not only when He acted before,
but where He is acting now. God is a dynamic God, always
on the move and I want to be with Him. I pledge myself to
be with Him!
